The Trust recognises that all students who are unable to attend school because of health needs are entitled to a high-quality education and we are committed to ensuring that the needs of vulnerable students are met.

The school follows its attendance procedures for students unable to attend school due to their health, including liaising with medical professionals, the education safeguarding service and holding multi-agency meetings. The school will consider putting in place part time or flexible timetables for these students and will make referrals for Early Help Assessments (EHAs) when appropriate. If after applying a graduated response a student continues to be unable to attend school, a referral will be made to the area Pupil Referral Unit (PRU) for medical tuition.

Students will be supported to be prepared for and entered for public examinations and national tests. Special arrangements for external examinations will be discussed and agreed at review meetings for individual students.
